



# Treetop Paver Quilt

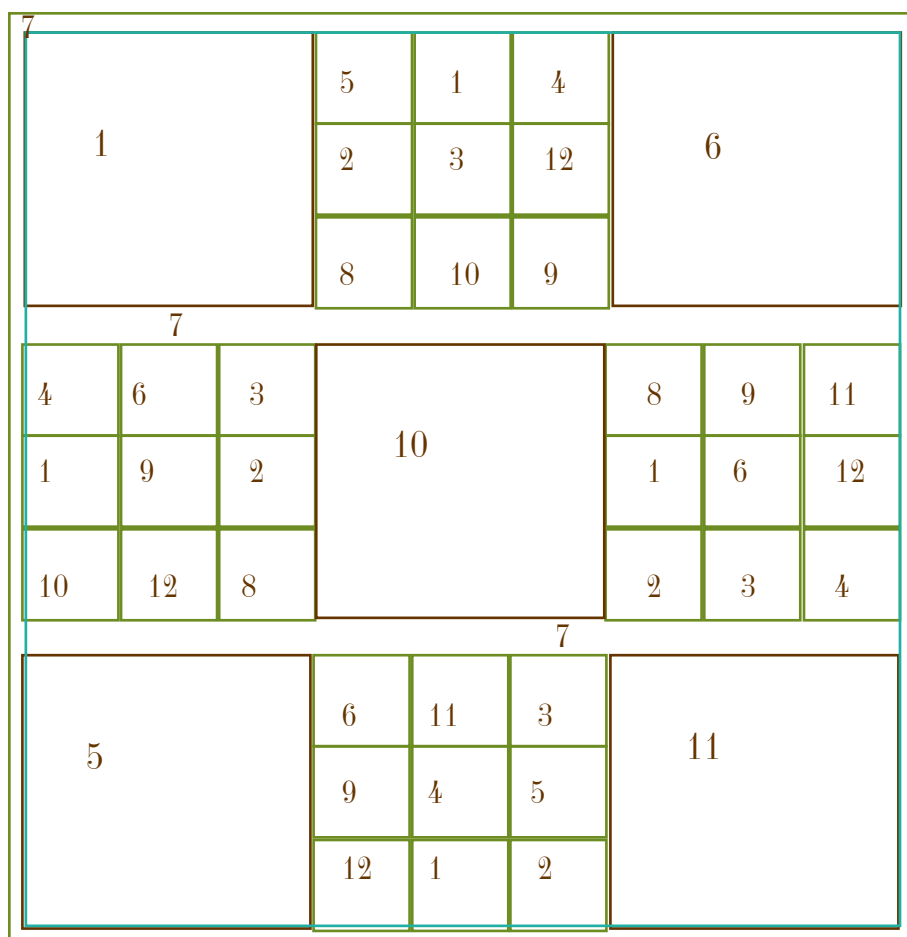
## Material:

12 unique fabrics

Used here:

1. TG47 AVOCADO Pods / 11/3 Yards or 1 Yard, 12" {122cm}
2. TG48 BROWN Treetop Birds / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}
3. TG49 BROWN Circles / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}
4. TG50 BLUE Scroll / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}
5. TG51 GREEN Stripe / 1 Yard {1 Meter}
6. TG52 IVORY Butterfly / 1 Yard {1 Meter}
7. TG53 GREEN Flower / 1½ Yards {138cm}
8. TG54 BROWN Reeds / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}
9. TG55 GREEN Daisies / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}
10. TG56 GREEN Magnolia / 1 Yard {1 Meter}
11. TG57 ORANGE Pomegranate / 1 Yard {1 Meter}
12. TG58 BLUE Narrow Stripes / 1/3 Yard or 12" {30cm}

+ 5 ½ Yards {5.25Meters} for backing fabric  
+ Cotton Batting King size - 120"x120" {310cm square}



## Cutting:

2 blocks

(A) 29"x29" {74cmx74cm}

Cut each of the fabrics:

1. 1(A), 4(B)
2. 4(B)
3. 4(B)
4. 4(B)
5. 1(A), 2(B)
6. 1(A), 3(B)
7. cut 5 strips, the width of the fabric, 4" {10cm} wide  
and for binding: cut 10 strips, width of the fabric, 3" {8cm} wide
8. 3(B)
9. 4(B)
10. 1(A), 2(B)
11. 1(A), 2(B)
12. 4(B)

BACKING: cut two lengths of the fabric 96" {2.5Meters} long

## *Sewing Instructions:* Making the blocks:

- BEGIN the quilt by making the patchwork blocks first. Begin with the first combination block, top row center: You need one of each of the following 9 of the smaller squares you previously cut~ (following the diagram on the first page you need these fabrics: Fabrics 5, 1, 4, 2, 3, 12, 8, 10 and 9.
- Right sides together, place one side of fabric 5 block onto fabric 1 and stitch together, press. Add block in fabric 4 onto the other side of 1. Now you have a row of 3 blocks.
- Repeat this with fabrics 2, 3 and 12; then with 8, 10 and 9. Now you have three combination blocks each of 3 squares.
- Take combination block of fabrics, 5, 1 and 4 and place right sides together so 2, 3 and 12 combo block matches, look at the diagram to follow making sure 2 sits below 5, 3 sits below 1 and so on. Now stitch these two together.
- Repeat this with the combination block of fabrics 8, 10 and 9. Now you should have a finished combination block of 9 fabrics. Block should measure 29" {26cm} square.
- Repeat for the remaining 3 combination blocks, using the diagram as reference for where to place the fabrics.
- Now you have 4 completed combination blocks made up of the various fabrics.

- PREPARE the middle strips of fabric 7 by creating two 86" {219cm or 2M 19cm} long strips. Do this by using the precut 4" wide strips and right sides together, add them together along their short edges. Press.

### Putting them together:

- PUTTING the blocks together is done by using the diagram as reference, first large block is in fabric #1, combination block 5.1.4/2.3.12/8.10.9, and then larger block in fabric #6. Place the combination block left side edge onto the right side edge of block in fabric 1, right sides together, stitch together. Repeat adding left side of block in fabric 6, onto the right side edge of the combination block. Press. You now have one long piece made up of 2 large blocks and 1 combination block measuring 29" x 86" {74cm x 219 cm}
- Repeat for the next row of blocks, this time the two combination blocks will be on the outside, and one large block in the middle in fabric #10.
- And again the third row of blocks, fabrics 5 and 11 are the large blocks and the center one is the combination block.

- AGAIN using the diagram as reference, place one of the prepared strips, 4" {10cm} wide, in fabric 7 along the bottom edge of the first combination strip of 3 blocks. Stitch this in place.

- Place the second row of blocks onto the bottom edge of this strip, top edge of the blocks and again stitch this in place.

- Now you should have two rows of blocks separated by one long narrow strip of fabric #7.

- Repeat placing the 2nd strip along the bottom edge of the almost complete quilt top, and then add the last row of blocks onto the bottom edge of the strip.

You now should have a complete quilt top.

### Backing:

- CREATE the backing of the quilt by stitching the two large pieces of fabric together along one long side, right sides together.

*You could use more than one fabric for the backing, just finish with a piece measuring slightly larger than your quilt top.*

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- LAYER the quilt backing onto a flat surface, right side down, then layer the cotton batting in place, and finally the quilt top, right side facing upward. Pin along the edges, smooth so there are no wrinkles, and using large safety pins pin periodically through all layers at each block corner.
- You are now ready to top stitch the quilt or send it to your favorite long arm quilter.
- Prepare the binding by adding the 3" strips together to create 360" or 10 yards {915cm or 9M, 15 cm} of binding.

### Finishing:

- Once the quilt top is completely top stitched and trimmed around the edges - bind the edges of the quilt with the prepared binding. I use a double binding by pressing the strip wrong sides together and placing the raw edges to raw edges along the quilt edge. Stitch in place, then press. And finally roll the binding over encasing the raw edges, and hand stitch closed.

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
